

Project Description

The grant project is organized into steps for participants, which will begin with recruitment in Fall 2022. Initially, students are provided with training and team building. Mentors are decided in the following year(s). Participants are not expected to pay travel, meal expenses, and housing expenses.

Year 1 – One week training in leadership and communication, mentorship with a research faculty at NMSU in a selected area

Year 2 – Paid summer internship at a Agricultural Experiment Station site in New Mexico

Year 3 – Paid summer internship at a Cooperative Extension Service county in New Mexico
